Intermediate grades can be given in the grading system with which the professor is most familiar. Professors will be given grade sheets for each course that must be filled out, signed and returned to Globalization Program office. Final Papers (with comments, if any) must also be handed in to the Globalization Program office at the end of the Semester, where they will be archived.

Academic policy is defined by the VIU Academic Council, which includes representatives of each the universities that are members of the consortium.

Each university defines how students of that university should be graded, and how the grades must be documented. This Grading Scale was last reviewed in November 2018.
