

VISIONARY VENICE with VIU and MOLESKINE

Modern Venice as mapped and re-designed on Moleskine notebooks. This is the theme of the singular exhibition entitled Mapping Contemporary Venice – from the city of today to the Venice of the future, promoted by Venice International University and Moleskine, curated by Raffaella Guidobono, to be opened on August 25 at Venice International University - VIU on the Island of San Servolo as a collateral event to the 12th International Architecture Exhibition.



Driven by the need to present a visionary concept of the city, the participating architects and exhibitors outline a conceptual passage to the territory's possible futures that encourages encounter between economic development and sustainable innovation.

The theme of the exhibition has been interpreted from two points of view: the first is called **Detour**, an itinerant project presenting Moleskine notebooks donated by their creators to the no-profit *lettera27* Foundation, here addressing Venice for the first time with a special edition after previous stops in New York, London, Paris, Berlin, Istanbul, and Tokyo; the second is known as **myDetour**, and presents notebooks from 20 students from VIU, and prestigious international academies and universities, as well as from inhabitants of the city of Venice itself.

Through the creations of the authors of this edition of **Detour**, Venice lends itself to new points of departure and unimagined approaches for the transformation of its geography. The city is seen as a "mutant and mutating" container ready to cast off its moorings and follow a new course plotted at the whims of the artists involved. Italy, Brazil, France, Germany, Spain, Mexico, Belgium, the United States, Hungary and Burkina Faso are the nations of origin of the Architects' studios presenting their works at VIU from August 26 onwards. All the following have been captured in Moleskine notebooks: the visionary "Acqua Alta nel 2060" idea by Dutch JDS Architects dialogues with the hot-air balloon story told by FGMF Arquitetos. Alterstudio Partners reveals autochthonous resources, while Franco La Cecla's provocative statement coexists alongside drawings by Giancarlo Carnevale, and 5+1AA replies to the experiments of Aranda\Lasch. Rojkind Arquitectos and the ASA/Flavio Albanese studio offer farsighted prospects. Without forgetting the carefully pondered reflections of Francis D. Kéré and Yona Friedman, with their "Altane Pubbliche" sketches, Giuseppe Amato\Qanat illustrates a modern city on foundation posts.

The authors featured in the show complement the rough sketches in their notebooks with models, photos, and videos. These notebooks will be presented inside open glass cases. After putting on special cotton gloves, visitors will be able to browse the pages freely in order to make a direct connection between the creative project conceived by each single artist and its subsequent development, page by page.

Venice International University has contributed to the drafting of the OECD report on the Venice metropolitan area. This two-year scientific survey showed that the territory's increasingly consolidated economic processes and circulation patterns were hindered, however, by the lack of an updated imaginary of visual and symbolic references. In **myDetour**, students offer stimuli for the creation of a new shared imaginary of the contemporary city.

Here in the Venice lagoon, students put down in notebooks their ideas and fragments of experiences just like the pioneers at the vanguard of the 20th Century art movement who used the same black notebooks for their spur of the moment writing and sketching in the streets and cafés of cities all over Europe. The result can be seen in the outright provocations, and ironic and unprecedented ideas all set down in these legendary notebooks that the public is encouraged to browse.

Venice International University (VIU) is an international higher education and research center on the island of San Servolo, just a few minutes away from St. Mark's square, the heart of the city of Venice. VIU was founded in 1995, as a joint venture between the two Venetian Universities (Ca' Foscari and Iuav), the Province of Venice, LMU from Munich, UAB from Barcelona, Duke University (Durham, USA) and the Foundation of Venice.

Moleskine

Moleskine is the heir of the legendary notebook used for the past two centuries by artists and thinkers, from Vincent Van Gogh to Pablo Picasso, from Ernest Hemingway to Bruce Chatwin. The anonymous and essential little black notebook, with its unique rounded corners, elastic closure, and expandable inner pocket, was originally produced for more than a century by a small French bookbinder that supplied Parisian stationery shops frequented by the international literary and artistic avant-garde. This trusty, pocket-sized travel companion held their sketches, notes, stories, and ideas before they became famous images or beloved books. In 1997, a small Milanese publisher brought the legendary notebook back to life, choosing for it this literary name, thus restoring an extraordinary tradition. Following Chatwin's footsteps, Moleskine® begins its journey once again, this time as an indispensable complement to today's mobile technology. Capturing reality on the move, preserving details, impressing the unique aspects of experience upon paper, Moleskine is an accumulator of ideas and emotions, which are then released over time.

lettera27 is a no-profit foundation established in July 2006
