Passport/ ID document	All foreigners who wish to pass the French customs must have a valid passport or ID document. For EU citizens, an ID card is sufficient. Passports and ID documents must be valid for the duration of your stay.
Visa and resident permit	Students from outside EU need a long stay Student Visa when staying for over 3 months in France. The student Visa must be obtained before arriving in France. Students must contact the closest Consulate General of France.
	EU Citizens and those from countries within the Schengen area do not need a visa or a resident permit. However, citizens from outside Schengen Area wanting to find a job while studying must have a residence permit.

Medical insurance	EU countries: students need to get their European Health Card at country of origin.
	 Non-EU countries: visitors from outside Europe need to subscribe to the French Social Security before the enrollment procedure (directly to the CPAM) unless they can provide private insurance with no limit of reimbursement for the entire mobility period.
Civil Liability and Repatriation insurance	In order to enroll in a French University, students must provide civil liability insurance. It is strongly recommended to have repatriation insurance.
