Gaetano Vivo is a Policy Officer at the

European Commission's Directorate General for European Civil Protection and Humanitarian Operations (DG ECHO). His responsibilities include, among other things, evaluating the current European legislation on disaster risk management (EU <u>Civil Protection Mechanism</u>) and advance new risk management and emergency preparedness policies in Europe, including for critical infrastructure. Prior to joining the European Commission (in 2016), Gaetano worked as a Disaster Risk Management Specialist for the World Bank in Washington DC, where he was Team Leader for investment projects in several Latin American and Caribbean countries focusing on: hydro-meteorological and climate services, disaster risk reduction and post-disaster recovery and reconstruction. With the World Bank he spent four years in Port-au-Prince, Haiti, where he served as the World Bank focal point for disaster risk management and resilience in the aftermath of the 2010 earthquake. Gaetano also worked with the Global Facility for Disaster Reduction and Recovery (GFDRR) in Washington DC and Brussels and with the Civil Protection Department of the Italian Government on a post-conflict reconstruction program in South Sudan. Native of Italy he holds a Master Degree in Communications and Political Science from the University of Bologna.
