Faculty short bios



Sara De Vido is Full Professor of International Law, Department of Economics, Ca' Foscari University of Venice, and is a delegate of the Rector for Gender Equality. She is senior expert on violence against women, by appointment of the European Commission, at the European Network of legal experts in gender equality and non-discrimination, based at Utrecht University. She is legal expert for the European Commission of the EU network on preventing

gender-based violence and domestic violence (2024-25) and drafted the report EU law in light of the Istanbul Convention. Legal Implications After the Accession. She is affiliated with the Manchester International Law Centre (UK), where she cofounded the Women in International Law Network (Wilnet). She is PI of the PRIN project Gendering international legal responses to chronic emergencies (2023-2025) and unit contact person of the PRIN PNRR project Ecce Human. She is also a member of the doctoral college 'Law, Market and Person' at Ca' Foscari University, Venice. She is a lecturer at Venice International University (she has taught Global Governance, Peace, Security, Cooperation and Development, Gender Studies and Globalisation, Ethics, Welfare and Human Rights).



Marina Calloni is a full professor of Political and Social Philosophy at the Department of Sociology and Social Research — University of Milan-Bicocca, winner of the competition for the return of Italian scholars. She obtained a PhD in Philosophy at the University of Pavia and a PhD in Political and Social Sciences at the European University Institute in Florence. She was a scholarship holder at the University of Frankfurt, a Senior researcher at the London

School of Economics; a contract professor in Bremen, Lugano, Kurume, Vienna; fellows at the University of Notre Dame and Columbia University. She has held conferences in 47 countries and published 250 scientific papers in several languages. She is responsible for the academic network <u>UNIRE</u> and is a consultant for the "Parliamentary Commission of Inquiry into Femicide" (Senate of the Republic). In 2020, President Mattarella awarded her the honor of "Officer of the Order of Merit of the Italian Republic". Research topics: human rights and fundamental freedoms; gender issues; critical theory of society; critique of violence; citizenship and public sphere; research networks and international cooperation.



Zeynep Gülru Göker is an Associate Professor of Political Science at the Sabancı University and the Director of SU Gender (Sabancı University Gender and Women's Studies Center of Excellence). She received her undergraduate degree in Social and Political Sciences from Sabanci University (2003) and her Ph.D. in Political Science from the City University of New York Graduate Center (2011) with a specialization in political

theory. Her research is focused on participatory and deliberative democracy, feminist political theory, gender and dialogue, the politics of gender equality and care ethics/politics. She was the co-PI at Sabanci University of EU GEARING-Roles (Gender Equality Actions in Research Institutions to Transform Gender Roles) (2019-2023) led by Deusto University. She is on the Management Committee of the COST Action Network: CHANGECODE: Research Network for Interdisciplinary Studies of Transhistorical Deliberative Democracy; on the editorial board of the Journal of Deliberative Democracy and is among the co-conveners of the European Group for Organizational Studies Standing Working Group "Pushing the Boundaries of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion: Theorizing Transformative Change in

Organizations." Her research has been published in high-ranking journals such as Gender, Place & Culture, Third World Quarterly, Globalization, Societies & Education, European Journal of Women's Studies, Women's Studies International Forum and New Perspectives on Turkey.



Micaela Frulli is Professor of International Law at the University of Florence. She was Marie Curie Fellow at the European University Institute (2010) and she has published extensively in the field of public international law. Her research interests include international criminal law, the law of immunities, United Nations peacekeeping. Amongst her publications: War Crimes and the Conduct of Hostilities. Challenges to Investigation and Adjudication (co-editor

with *Judge* F.Pocar and Prof M. Pedrazzi, Elgar, 2013). She is member of the Editorial Board of QIL (Questions of international) and member of the *International Law Association* study group on the role of individual in international law.



Daniela Belliti is a research fellow in political philosophy (SPS/01) at the Department of Sociology and Social Research, University of Milano-Bicocca. Her research focuses on gender-based violence, migration, and the role of universities in promoting gender equality. She is a key contributor to the UN.I.RE. project, which aims to strengthen academic networks against gender violence. She has co-authored several publications, including works on

solidarity during the COVID-19 pandemic and the role of education in preventing gender violence. She has participated in seminars addressing gender violence in migration contexts. She is also involved in the SFERA project, focusing on the development of anti-violence networks. Her work contributes to the advancement of gender studies and social justice initiatives.



Ayşe Betül Çelik received her Ph.D. in political science from the State University of New York at Binghamton in 2002 and is a full Professor at Sabanci University in Istanbul, Turkey. She teaches political science and conflict resolution. She is an expert on ethnic conflict, reconciliation, dialogue, forced migration, peace processes and gender and peacebuilding. She has several articles and a co-authored book on Turkey's Kurdish Question, forced Kurdish migration and role of NGOs in the conflict. She also teaches gender awareness to high school teachers in

several cities in Turkey. She is one of the founders of the Turkey Antenna of the Mediterranean Women Mediators Network. Prof. Çelik received "Ufficiale Dell Ordine Della Stella D'Italia"- Official (Ufficiale) of Order of the Star of Italy (Ordine della Stella d'Italia) which is a recognition of the highest degree conferred by the President of the Italian Republic in 2021 for her work in conflict resolution and gender.



Cenk Özbay is a professor of sociology and gender studies at Sabancı University. He holds a PhD in sociology and a graduate certificate in gender studies from the University of Southern California. His research explores gender and sexualities, masculinities, queer cultures, and social inequalities. He focuses on globalization, neoliberalism,

urban studies, youth cultures, and workplace governmentality. His work has been published in top journals such as *GLQ*, *Sexualities*, and *Urban Geography*. He has authored and edited several books on gender, intimacy, and urban life in Turkey.

His latest work examines queer spaces, neoliberalism, and masculinity in contemporary Turkey. He has received multiple fellowships and research grants from national and international institutions. He aims to bridge critical theory, activism, and interdisciplinary scholarship through his research.



Sara Dal Monico is a Research Grant Holder at Ca' Foscari University of Venice, specializing in international law and human rights. She holds a Ph.D. in International Law and has contributed extensively to scholarly literature. Her research interests encompass the intersection of international law with human rights, focusing on issues such as the criminalization of abortion, the principle of solidarity in the

European Union, and the legal dimensions of free trade agreements. She has authored several publications, including articles in the ORDINE INTERNAZIONALE E DIRITTI UMANI journal and contributions to the EUWEB Legal Essays series. She has also co-authored a chapter on the Istanbul Convention in the book Preventing and Combating Violence Against Women and Domestic Violence by Elgar Publishing. Her work critically examines the implications of legal frameworks on gender and human rights. Dr. Dal Monico is actively involved in academic discourse, contributing to the advancement of legal scholarship in her areas of expertise.
